Wow, another remarkable year in the books for The Giving Exchange.

When I ask donors why they choose to support our mission, I hear time and time again these three things:

- 1. **Projects:** it feels both good and smart to help people help themselves
- 2. **Transparency:** we know each of our beneficiaries personally and can introduce you to the exact individual whose life you've changed
- 3. **Impact:** 100% of donations go directly to our projects and the US dollar is stretched to make a huge difference in the communities we serve

The Giving Exchange is a small but mighty non-profit. As you'll see in this year's annual report, 272 individuals donated a total of \$399,000 to The Giving Exchange in 2022. We developed trusting relationships with nine outstanding beneficiaries and invested \$103,000 into their solutions and communities.

I started The Giving Exchange in 2013 with my daughter, Alissa. Since then, our organization has impacted more than 65,000 individual lives.

In the coming years, I see us scaling up to replicate our model in other countries, even beyond East Africa, and continuing to hone our focus on income-generating, community-building, project-based economic justice work.



### The Process

The Giving Exchange's projects change annually based on a thorough application process conducted by a team of staff, volunteers, and Board Members. We assess each new application with weighted criterion including feasibility, impact and sustainability. Together with the beneficiary, we develop achievable metrics customized to each project.

In 2022, we received 70 new project applications – more than ever before – a testament to our work and reputation in East Africa.

# Mushroom Farm with Zim Conserve

This year, our first ever project in Zimbabwe was a mushroom farming program that provides employment, business training, and a sustainable income for a community suffering from drought.

Adding oyster mushrooms to their permaculture gardens has shown many benefits, as it requires less water but yields much more than other local crops, and it has a lower carbon footprint.

ZimConserve has successfully trained 50 people and generated over

\$10,000 income.

The profit made has enabled

300 individuals

to access education, health, and improved livelihood.

# Cindy from Njoo Dada Trust



Meet Cindy, a young woman who, in 2016, found herself in a dangerous environment, and found refuge at Njoo Dada Trust, home for teenage mothers in peril.

In the last three years, The Giving Exchange has donated sewing machines, a classroom, and funded business training for residents of Njoo Dada Trust.

In March, our team visited Njoo Dada and met Cindy in person. We learned that she excelled in the trainings, has graduated from high school, and is now in college with a marketable business plan and customer base.

# Back to Kenya

In March, we returned to Kenya for the first time in two years with a team of 10 Ambassadors.

The purpose of this trip is to:

- · Raise awareness
- Meet with our beneficiaries
- Build our local partnerships
- Oversee and report on projects

Over the course of eight days, our team visited four children's homes, two schools, one community self-help group, and one remote Maasai village in Amboseli National Park!

Our next Trip to Kenya is scheduled for August 2023.





## Skills Training with Inspire Girls Foundation

Inspire Girls Foundation applied to The Giving Exchange with a project that appealed directly to the hearts of TGE's staff and donors because of its alignment with our strongly held value of women's rights and gender quality.

The project investment procured ten tailoring machines and various accessories (hooks, needles, greasing oil, etc.), learning materials, monthly allowances for the trainers, and monthly rent for the classrooms for six months.

## BSFL Animal Feed Production with Karambi Group

One of the most unique projects The Giving Exchange has ever taken on must be our new partnership with Karambi Group for People with Disabilities which uses using Black Soldier Fly Larvae (BSFL) to produce Animal Feed.

The price of animal feed in East Africa has skyrocketed in the last two years due to inflation, the War in Ukraine, and the severe drought. All of our animal-rearing projects are feeling the strain.



Get this clever alternative: Black Soldier Flies are found in animal waste and produce larvae that feed on any organic decomposable matter. BSFL is high in nutrients, quick to reproduce, and strengthens the immunity of animals.

41 animals in surrounding farms have been sustained through the feed produced, and the growth rate is promising, unlike before.

This project generated over \$4,000 profit, which will be used to expand production and start a chicken coop.

# Hybrid Gala

The Giving Exchange held our third annual Gala on Giving Tuesday, November 29, 2022.

It was our first ever in-person event, held at the Lesher Center for the Arts in Walnut Creek. At the same time, we couldn't host this event without including our supporters around the world, so the Gala was also live streamed to a virtual audience tuning in from their own homes.

114 guests joined us in-person at the theater and about 100 more supporters joined us virtually online.

During the main event, our Director of Operations, Reanna Placide, delivered a passionate keynote speech about the impact that our donors have made on communities in Kenya, Uganda and Zimbabwe in the last 12 months, and how we hope to accomplish so much more in the weeks to come.


